“God Doesn’t Need Our Money; God’s Work Does Need Our Money”

Congratulations! If you’re reading this it means the title didn’t turn you off and move on to another article in the Messenger. And yes, I will be sharing my concern over our offerings being down \$21,700 as of April 30 from what we projected to have received, but first I want to share this reminder.

God doesn’t need our money. Yes, it is true that Scripture tells us God does ask us to give our “first fruits” back to God as an offering. In ancient Israel that meant the first tenth of the crop or the choicest animals of the flock or herd. But it’s not like God needs the grain, goats, or grapes for survival or for personal use. What we offer has always been meant for another purpose – to serve God’s will in the world and provide for the needs of others. That’s why...

God’s work does need our money. Whether it was feeding the poor and priests with the grain offered in ancient Israel or providing for the needs of others through the work of Urban Promise, Caring Hearts, New Visions Day Shelter, Interfaith Homeless Outreach Council, or other social ministry agencies God’s work in the world needs the resources God has first provided us. And in this day and age that means our money. Yes, giving of our time and abilities are also needed to do God’s work but let’s be honest, it also requires financial resources.

The congregation of Our Savior cannot effectively do the work of the gospel we have been called to do without our congregation faithfully giving of their pocketbooks as well as pocket calendars.

As I write this article I am concerned with the downward trend in regular envelope offerings so far this year. As stated above, after the first four months of 2018 we are behind \$21,700 from what we anticipated to have received by this time based on the giving trend averages over the last four years. There may be a number of reasons for this. Previous faithful givers are no longer with us in 2018 due to death or departure from our area. Some may be giving their annual offering through a gift of stock and are waiting for the right moment to maximize the gift. Others may be providing their annual gift through a portion of their Required Minimum Distribution that has not yet come due. Others who live off of commission may be having a slow start to the year. For any of these reasons I’m not that concerned as I trust in the end our congregation is faithful to the ministry we share. And of course if your offering is down because your income has also decreased we give thanks for what you are able to contribute. Paul reminds us in 2 Corinthians that God does not expect us to give from what we do not have.

What concerns me is if giving is down because members don’t realize how much every gift matters in making ministry possible through Our Savior’s worship, programs, and events. Your financial contribution *does* matter, not as required dues to God but as your participation in God’s kingdom being revealed in this world.

So where do we go from here? I suggest the following now that giving statements have been sent in May to everyone in the congregation.

1. Check your statement. Read the letter from me and the Congregation Council. It gives a variety of ways to be faithful in supporting God’s work through Our Savior’s ministry through the summer months.
2. Consider how much you are giving toward God’s work in the world through our ministry. Does it reflect your faith and trust in God to provide you with all things? In the priorities of your budget and spending, where is God’s work ranked? Is it time to change your giving pattern?

God may not need our money, but God’s work in the world certainly does. Let us be faithful to the work God has given us to do in this time and in this place.

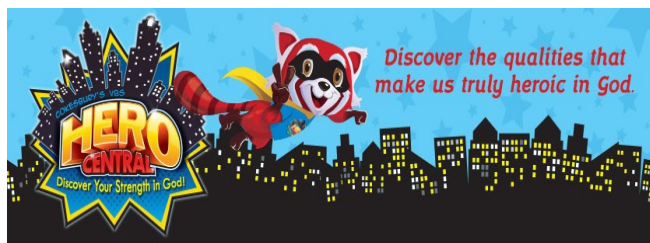

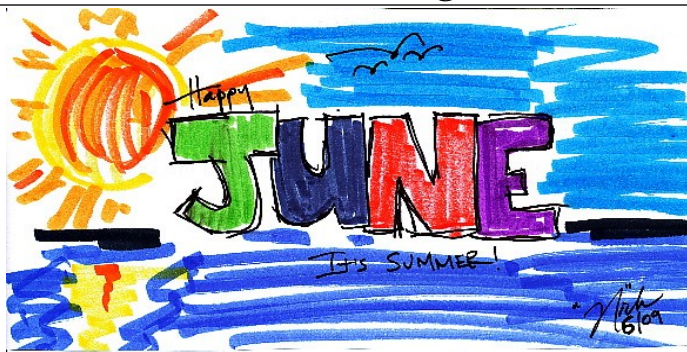

New Jersey Synod Assembly Highlights

The following memorial and resolutions were passed at the New Jersey Synod Assembly held at the Hyatt Regency in East Brunswick from May 11-12. For a full wording of the memorial and resolutions identified below please see Pastor Wayne Zschech.

Memorial Concerning the 50th Anniversary of Ordination of Women:

This memorial passed and encourages congregations, synods, and our Churchwide bodies to lift up and celebrate the role of ordained women in

ministry in 2020 as a part of the 50th anniversary of the ordination of women in the Lutheran Church. It also calls upon those same bodies to examine how this church still participates in patriarchy, sexism, and other discriminatory practices that diminish the role and value of ordained women have in parish and synodical ministry. Synods and congregations are urged to provide analyses of our various policies and practices with respect to preparation for ministry, compensation, call process, mobility, ministry roles and debt following seminary.

Resolution on Gun Violence: This resolution passed after considerable debate and focuses on the following points.

- Support of legislation to ban civilian ownership of military style weapons

- NJ Synod organized events be gun-free spaces and congregations are encouraged hold events that are gun-free spaces as well.

- NJ Synod continue and increase engagement in educating, organizing, advocacy, and direct action to reduce gun violence and to assist in equipping congregations, clergy, and lay leaders to engage in such work, appropriate to local contexts, capacity, and discernment.

Resolution on Fair and Sustainable Policies for Non-Rostered Lay Personnel: This resolution was referred to Synod Council and encourages congregations to review their benefits and compensation plans for non-rostered personnel to make sure they are paying a livable wage and provide comparable benefits to rostered staff as well as request the synod provide benefits and compensation guidelines. It was referred to Synod Council who will provide a recommendation at the next Synod Assembly in 2019.

Resolution on Undocumented Immigrants This resolution was referred to the Immigration Task Force of the New Jersey Synod. It included increased connections with the various judicatories, agencies and communities involved with immigrants' rights, maintaining a contact list of safe spaces for undocumented immigrants and how pastors might get connected to them in the event a pastor encounters a person in need of such space. It also asks the New Jersey Synod to support and equip congregations that seek to become Sanctuary Congregations within the synod.
