"Time to Widen the Tent" By Pastor Wayne Zschech

In Isaiah 54:2 the prophet proclaims, "Enlarge the site of your tent, and let the curtains of your habitations be stretched out; do not hold back; lengthen your cords and strengthen your stakes." In other words, "be prepared for growth!" Be prepared for more people in the community. Be prepared for the demands that

come with that increase. And as we begin a new program year at Our Savior it is indeed time to widen the tent for we are already growing! Our average worship attendance is up 5% over last year, and we continue to welcome at least one first time guest every other week in worship. We anticipate 30 youth in confirmation class and over 60 children in our Sunday faith education program from age 3 to grade 6. We anticipate new faces to begin participating in choir, Mission Quilts, Bible and book studies, and other fellowship and service events that kick off this month. It is truly time to widen the tent!

Widening the tent also includes both widening the opportunities for people to be engaged in ministry as well as widening our "relationship tent" when it comes to getting to know new names and faces. Remember what it was like to be the new student in school and college? To be the new player on the team, dancer in the group, singer in the choir? Remember what it was like to be the new neighbor on the block or employee at work? If you do you also remember how the one goal you hoped to achieve was to make a new friend, to have someone to connect with in the new place. That not only requires the new person reaching out to get to know the people in our congregation, but it also means us reaching out to them. It will mean intentionally breaking away from a conversation with a member we know well to introduce ourselves to a new face and introduce them to those who have been under this tent for some time.

One of the ways we can better widen our tent is by widening the opportunities for people with similar interests to get together in small groups. We already have a number of small groups in our congregation that continue to promote Christian fellowship and friendships such as the Library Ladies, Mission Quilts, Handymen, choirs, confirmation, Adult Bible Study, and occasionally a book study. However, are there other interests you have that lend to creating a new small group here at Our Savior? What if there was a movie club that met to go to a movie and then discussed it afterward? We've had a softball team in the past. Are there other recreational leagues we could field a team? We've had a mother's group meet in the past. Is it time to start one again? What about a dad's group? A men's group? A young adult group? A newlywed group? I challenge you to think of a group that could get started THAT YOU WOULD BE INTERESTED IN PARTICIPATING IN and also being a part of making it happen, and then letting me know how I can facilitate that becoming a reality. In doing so, we just may have to widen the tent again! See you this September for the beginning of another incredible year of ministry.

Confirmation Ministry Begins with Orientation Sept. 9 at 6:30; Blessing Service Sep 23 at 10:30 Worship

Another year of confirmation ministry with catechetical instruction begins Sunday, Sep 9, at 6:30 with a "Back to Confirmation Night" orientation for both youth and parents in the Church Sanctuary where the goals and volunteer opportunities of the program will be reviewed. The class of about 29 seventh and eighth grade youth along with parent Guides will cover Sacraments, Lutheran Worship, and the Apostle's Creed at biweekly Learn Events, and Our Lutheran Heritage at the fall Lock-In Retreat. They will also receive acolyte training as a part of the retreat. This program utilizes the Head to the Heart Power Point themes produced by Faith Inkubators. Additional components of the program include:

- Play Events coordinated with the Oasis Youth ministry
- Serve Events ranging from making meals for My Father's House and Youth Sunday Worship leadership, to serving either as an acolyte, nursery aide, or singing in the Youth Choir.
- Participation in a Stepping into the Catechism Blessing during the 10:30 worship on September 23.

Confirmation isn't just for youth any more. Parents are invited to gather for Learn Events and participate in their own Parent Group for fellowship and rediscovering the faith applications of Luther's Small Catechism in their daily lives. While this may be a lot to ask of families with extremely full schedules, Pastor Wayne strongly believes the most important way to teach faith to our children is to first teach and empower loving adults to model and share the faith with them. In addition, parents have the opportunity to explore what they once learned in confirmation from the perspective and life experience of an adult and how that impacts their own faith in daily life.

Confirmation Lock-In Focuses on Lutheran Heritage

On Friday and Saturday, September 28-29, the Confirmation Youth will gather at the church for a lock-in retreat followed by a



community building experience at Camp Edge in Alloway. The Lock-In portion of the retreat begins Friday, Sep 28 at 6:30 and will include acolyte training and a focus on how Lutheranism began at the Reformation and some fun facts about our denomination today.

On Saturday the group will travel to Camp Edge in Alloway for a High Ropes Course session to enhance becoming more tightly knit as a community in the body of Christ. The cost of the event is \$25/participant to cover the cost of Camp Edge fees. Parents will be chaperoning the event both overnight at the church and at Camp Edge.

Managing God's Gifts To Us

Summer Stewardship Snapshot

Back in May the Congregation Resources Ministry team shared that by April Our Savior's anticipated Envelope Offerings were behind -\$17,679 from what we projected would have been received by the end of April. Members were asked to consider this

shortfall in their giving as we headed into the summer months and many of you have responded generously! As of the end of July our Envelope Offerings are \$3,829 ahead of what was projected, largely due to some members making their annual contribution during the months of June and July. We also anticipate August's offerings to fall short of what was anticipated as we use a 5-year rolling average to calculate monthly projected offerings and in one of those years there was an annual offering made, which will skew the calculation slightly from normal. BOTTOM LINE: The congregation is meeting our financial needs for ministry and we are heading into the fall without worry. Thank you for your faithful and generous ongoing financial support of the ministry we share with the resources God has first provided you.

Additionally, our summer worship attendance also was higher than usual, with average worship attendance being higher than it's been in the last eight years for May, June, and July. In fact, Our Savior's average worship attendance is about 5% higher so far this year than last year, which we hope carries forward into the fall as well. The Holy Spirit is certainly calling and gathering God's people to the font, table, and pulpit at Our Savior. We look forward to seeing you in September as well and invite a friend to join you when you come!



Faith Stepping Stones Blessing Services September Snapshot


September is a month chock full of blessing services for our families participating our Faith Stepping Stones ministry of faith formation. They all occur during the 10:30 worship service and are as follows:

Always Being Made New: The Campaign for the ELCA

Nearly four years ago, the ELCA launched its first comprehensive campaign, Always Being Made New: The Campaign for the ELCA, with the goal of raising \$198 million in support of churchwide ministries across the United States and around the world. Now, as we enter the final year of this five-year effort, we look to the future of this church by highlighting the campaign's Leadership priority, including the ELCA Fund for Leaders and Youth and Young Adults. Through these ministries, we are accompanying youth and young adults in their faith journeys and supporting talented, gifted seminarians as they prepare to begin a life of rostered ministry.

With the \$4 million campaign goal for Youth and Young Adults, the ELCA will support new and growing youth leadership academies, camps, labs, and schools across the country; provide funding for leadership internships with Lutheran Services in America; and provide grants for collaborative and creative youth and young adult ministry initiatives.

How will this campaign affect LCOS youth and young adults? From June 27, 2018 to July 1, 2018, our Director of Youth and Family Ministry, Jaime Frazier, will accompany two youth from LCOS, Sophia Howard and Hailey Melcher, to the National Youth Gathering in Houston, Texas. Sponsored by the ELCA, the gathering will focus on the theme, "This Changes Everything" and hopes to help the youth become leaders in the church. The expected attendance is 30,000. Nadia Volz-Weber will address the crowd; the New Jersey Synod Bishop, Tracie Bartholomew, will meet with NJ youth; Houston will find service projects for 30,000 kids; representatives from seminaries will discuss their calling to ministry; and all participants will worship together and take communion.

Jaime, who grew up in LCOS, loved her Youth Group experiences here. After graduating from Immaculata University with a major in religion, she earned a master's degree from the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia, concentrating in Youth and Family Ministry. Jaime feels that "church is a welcoming place for youth, a second home" and wants to help them deepen their faith.
