"December a Great Month to INVITE Friends, Family, and Strangers to Church"

December is a time of invitations. We get invited to one party and then another. We get invited to lunch or dinner at one or another friend's home. We get invited to concerts, plays, and ballet performances of the Nutcracker. We do our fair share of inviting others to the same in our weeks leading up to Christmas Day. The big question is, how often do we think about inviting people to join in our celebrating the birth of Christ at our Christmas Eve worship? Or how often do we think about inviting people to worship during Advent as we prepare for that celebration?

Jesus once told his disciples he would make them fish for people. But if we don't invite people to join us for worship or other ministry events or projects and expect people will simply show up that would be like going fishing and hoping the fish jump in the boat! December is an excellent month to invite people who don't have a church home to worship and various other events focused on Christmas. Here are some examples and opening lines you might try to invite them to join you.





Dec 1-9: Advent Giving Tree Shopping: "Say while we're out shopping can you help me buy a gift for my Advent Giving Tree family? Our church purchases over 200 gifts for families in need living in Camden County every Christmas and we picked up several tags from the Advent Giving Tree at our church last Sunday. Want to help me?" (If they ask more about it, invite them to join you for worship on Sunday and pick up a tag or two for themselves to help out.)

Dec 2: Drop N Shop Childcare: "I've still got some shopping to do for my children and my church's youth group is sponsoring a Drop 'n Shop childcare event from Noon to 3:00 on Sunday

IT'S TIME TO Dec 2. They'll have crafts, games, and children's Christmas shows for the kids to be involved in so **DROP-N-SHOP** they'll have some fun while we get some holiday tasks done. Want to drop off the kids and join me? We could even go to worship together beforehand if you like. Then we can grab some lunch and catch up along the way."





Dec 9: Children's Christmas Pageant: "Our Sunday school children are providing a unique retelling of the Nativity story and experiencing the wonder of Jesus' birth amidst all the hustle and bustle of life. There's even a breakfast planned for after the pageant so there's one less meal to worry about! With our children being such good friends I think they might enjoy seeing them in the audience. Why don't you come as our guests that day and join us?

We'd love to have you and hope you can stay for the breakfast."

Dec 16: Lessons & Carols Worship: "Say, our church is holding a really great musical worship on December 16. It's a Lessons and Carols worship at the 10:30 service featuring all the choirs and guest instrumentalists. It's really a great way to get into the mood for Christmas and easy to follow along as well. Want to join us?"





Christmas Eve: "What are you doing Christmas Eve this year? Our church has a beautiful candlelight worship each year and we find it sets the tone for our celebration of Christmas the next day. Don't forget to invite someone who doesn't have a church home to join you this Advent as we prepare for the celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas.

Christmas Eve Candlelight Communion Worship Times; 5:00, 8:00, & 10:00

Join the congregation in celebrating the birth of Christ this Christmas Eve at any of the three worship times that best fit your schedule. Here are the times and a brief description of each.

5:00 Family Worship: A Children's Sermon and anthems sung by both the Cherub and Children's Choirs as well as the Children's Bell Choir ringing are the highlight of this worship service. This is a great family-focused worship and we hope you will invite your friends without a church home to join you. Communion will be celebrated and the service ends with candlelight singing of Silent Night.

8:00 Traditional/Youth Worship: The Youth Choir and Bell Choir continue to be the featured choir at this service and returning college students are invited to join them in singing familiar anthems if they choose. A traditional sermon is preached. Communion will be celebrated and the service ends with candlelight singing of Silent Night.

10:00 Classic "Midnight" Worship: The Adult Choir and Bell Choir are the featured choirs at this service with a traditional sermon preached from the pulpit or aisle. While this worship typically ended after midnight when held at 11:00 the Worship and Music Committee decided to move it up and hour after several requests for an earlier time as 11:00 has become too late for many to attend. Communion will be celebrated and the service ends with candlelight singing of Silent Night.

Advent Brunch



Advent Brunch for Adults from Noon-2:00. Advent Brunch returns to Rhoads Ave this year with Pastor Wayne and Kate Zschech hosting the event at the parsonage next door to the church. Adult beverag-

es will be available as well as a ham, and guests are invited to bring a brunch item to share with other participants. This is a great way for members and guests to mingle and get to know one another in a festive setting and you won't even need to move your car! You can even use the church ovens if needed to keep your entrée warm during the 10:30 worship. Parents with young children will not even need to worry about childcare as the Oasis Youth Group is holding a childcare event at the church during the same time.

"Deck the Halls" for Christmas from Noon-2:00. The congregation will work with confirmation youth and parents to prepare our church for Christmas by putting up the two trees in the sanctuary and one in the narthex with lights and Chrismon ornaments. This is a great time for families to learn about the meaning behind the unique Chrismon ornaments that adorn our sanctuary trees each year.



Lunch will be coordinated by Director of Youth and Family Ministry, Jaime Frazier, and the three large artificial pine trees will be put up, strung with lights, and decorated with the handmade Crismons immediately following the meal. Help get our church ready for the Christmas Pageant and Lessons and Carols events in the coming two weeks. Contact the church office if you plan to attend to insure enough pizzas are ordered. Homemade Christmas cookies are always a great treat to share if you would like to bring some.



Please stop by our table in the narthex after each worship service on Dec. 2 and 9 to receive your ornament and support hurricane relief. Thank you!




Boxed Envelopes Available In Nart hex for Pick-Up from Dec 2 until New Year's Eve

October's average weekly worship attendance of 163 was down 14% compared to 2017 and 12% lower than the average of October's attendance in 2014-2017.

October's envelope offerings of \$37,652 was \$4,166 lower than the plan of \$41,818 This was 10% lower than the plan but 12% higher than last October.

THE GIFT OF EDUCATION LCOS Supports Urban Promise College Students

Believing that one person, given the opportunity, can make a difference in the world, Our Savior's Social Ministry Committee and Memorial Gifts Board have collaborated to provide scholarships totaling \$8,000.00 per year to students actively involved with Urban Promise Ministries in Camden who are continuing their education beyond high school. Since 2009 sixteen students have been awarded scholarships. Recipients must be enrolled full-time in a university, college, or trade school and must maintain a minimum GPA. 
