“Children Welcome to Be Seen AND Heard In Worship”

There’s an old saying I remember my “elders” telling me when I was a child. “Children are to be seen and not heard.” This principle was to be obeyed when our family was visiting in another adult’s home, eating at restaurants, shopping in department stores (along with the additional “Look, but don’t touch” rule), and sadly in worship. I can understand parents not wanting to be interrupted amidst adult conversation with friends. I can understand not wanting a child’s verbal excitement at eating out to disturb nearby patrons’ enjoyment. And I can certainly understand not wanting to hear the endless questions of “When are we going to leave? How much longer? Can we get something to drink?” while one is trying to find their size in pants, shirts, or dresses. What I can’t understand is not wanting to hear the sound of children in worship.

When parents bring their infant or child to the font they make some promises to God and God’s people. They promise to live with them among God’s faithful people and to bring them to the word of God and the holy supper. They promise to teach them the Lord’s Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. They promise to place in their hands the holy scriptures and nurture them in faith and prayer. From the time an infant or child is baptized we, the church, the body of Christ, expect and welcome children to be seen and heard in worship. After all, that’s what we agreed to do when the pastor asks, “People of God, do you promise to support (name) and pray for them in their new life in Christ?” Cultivating the habit of attending and participating in worship doesn’t have a starting age. The best time to start is before they will ever remember.

And when parents bring their infants and toddlers to worship there are certain sounds we ought to expect to hear. I expect to hear squeals and other loud noises from infants as they discover what their voices sound like in room as large as a sanctuary. One day those squeals and gurgles will become the sound of cherubs singing our songs of faith. When little ones get hungry or feel uncomfortable I expect to hear some crying. If adults can get “hangry” (hungry and angry at the same time) why wouldn’t we expect an infant to cry and fuss when they are too? One day they will hunger for the food of faith in the bread and wine offered at the Lord’s Table. Worship is a routine we learn over time and with learning any routine there are questions asked that need to be answered. So I expect to hear children asking parents why we are doing what we are doing as parents help their children learn the words of the liturgy so they too can participate.

Last year I baptized 17 infants and children. This year I anticipate baptizing nearly as many with all the births we’ve celebrated in the last week and weeks to come. With all those newly baptized infants and children I welcome worship services where they are not only seen but we get to hear their new life sounds of wonder, joy, and even “hangry-ness”. It is the sound of the *whole* body of Christ gathered together for worship that a multi-generational congregation like Our Savior’s gets to hear each week. This Mother’s Day, when our youth lead worship for Youth Sunday, may we hear the voices of future choir members, readers, worship assistants, and even pastors in the coos, gurgles, squeals, and screeches of our littlest members and guests. For in this congregation, infants and children are welcome to be seen and heard as we gather for worship.

Discussion of 1st Book of Samuel Begins April 29/May 1

The message of 1 Samuel comes to God’s people as they struggled to settle in the Promised Land. They were loosely organized and ill-equipped to deal with their iron-armored enemies. Out of their fear and lack of trust in God, they asked for a king. The book of 1 Samuel shows us where such fear and lack of trust lead and how a faithful God works to save God’s people.

This is not a Bible lecture but rather a discussion of how what we read in Scripture is applicable to our daily life and faith. Attend either Mondays from 7:30-9:00 in Room 112 or Wednesday mornings from 9:30-11:00 at the home of Linda Powell (603 Crystal Lake Avenue in Haddon Township). **No prior attendance or scriptural**

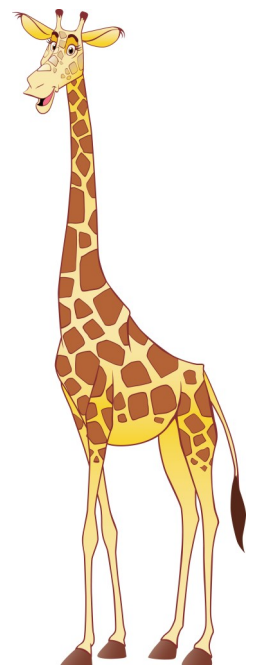
