Christmas Eve Candlelight Communion Worship Times; 5:00, 8:30, & 10:00

Join the congregation in celebrating the birth of Christ this Christmas Eve at any of the three worship times that best fit your schedule. Here are the times and a brief description of each.

5:00 Family Worship: A Children's Sermon and anthems sung by both the Cherub and Children's Choirs as well as the Children's Bell Choir ringing are the highlight of this worship service. This is a great family-focused worship and we hope you will invite your friends without a church home to join you. Communion will be celebrated and the service ends with candlelight singing of Silent Night.

8:30 Traditional/Youth Worship: The Youth Choir and Bell Choir continue to be the featured choir at this service and returning college students are invited to join them in singing familiar anthems if they choose. A traditional sermon is preached. Communion will be celebrated and the service ends with candlelight singing of Silent Night.

10:00 Classic "Midnight" Worship: The Adult Choir and Bell Choir are the featured choirs at this service with a traditional sermon preached from the pulpit or aisle. Communion will be celebrated and the service ends with candle-light singing of Silent Night.

Christmas Pageant & Breakfast Set for Dec 15 @ 9:15 AM in Parish Hall

This pageant is an original script written predominantly by our own Bonnie Richards and involves our children from age 3 to grade 5. 


Advent Brunch Held at Parsonage on Sunday, Dec 1 from Noon-2:00

As you drive to and from the stores this holiday season I'm sure you'll see a car magnet or two with a depiction of the Nativity stuck to the back bumper that reads, "The Reason for the Season." It's a reminder to all of us who may have barely survived grocery shopping at Wegmans, finding a parking spot at the malls, or

the post office line out the door when mailing gifts that Christmas is about the birth of Jesus. To be more theologically accurate, Christmas is the incarnation of God in the person of Jesus. But what exactly is the Incarnation?

In Crazy Talk: A not-so-stuffy dictionary of theological terms the incarnation is defined as **The out-of-this-world notion that the eternal and infinite God came down to this earth in the finite and first-century Jesus of Nazareth.** It further explains, "That he was conceived by the power of the Spirit means that he was fully God in the flesh... But that he was born of the virgin Mary means that he was fully God in the flesh [in carne]. It's easy to forget, but Jesus came into the world the same way we do – the birth canal... He wasn't just God pretending to be human; he was completely human in every aspect of life." (pp. 92-93)

Jesus was human in every aspect of our life. Think about that for a second or thirteen. Jesus was as human as you and me. If you're a teenager battling acne and think, "I bet Jesus never had zits." Yes he did. Or when you get sick around the holidays (as we all do at one time or another) and think, "I bet Jesus never got sick." Guess what, he probably did. Jesus endured the same challenges of humanity we all are faced with and even more than most. He was born in a stable and not a sterile delivery room. He fled as a refugee to a foreign land because Herod was willing and did commit infanticide for every male child in Bethlehem two years old and younger after Jesus birth. He knew hunger in the wilderness. He experienced rejection by the very people he came to reveal God's good news. He was abandoned on the cross and died the most horrible death known to Roman Empire (because the torture of watching The Christmas Story had not yet been invented). He died – like we all will die. But then he was raised – as we will all be raised. Our humanity was his humanity, and that includes the resurrection as well.

Isn't that what we proclaim when we sing the carol, Good Christian Friends, Rejoice?

He has opened heaven's door, and we are blest forevermore.

Christ was born for this! Christ was born for this!

Now ye need not fear the grave; Jesus Christ was born to save!

Calls you one and calls you all to gain the everlasting hall.

Christ was born to save! Christ was born to save!

Jesus knows our humanity, with all its ups and downs, joys and struggles, because Jesus was born truly human. So as we scurry around this Christmas season maybe we need to reflect on the Incarnation – God's word becoming flesh – and how God's word might become flesh in us. How might God's love be revealed in our hands and feet? How might God's grace be made flesh in our embrace of acceptance? How might God's mercy be made flesh with our tears of forgiveness and a kiss of peace? Jesus is the reason for the season, but on a deeper level than simply a story of a babe born in a barn. The incarnation is the true reason for the season and may you experience it and reveal it the days leading up to, during, and after our celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas. Merry Christmas!

Bible Discussion for Daily Life on Gospel of John Begins Dec 9/11 (7 weeks)

An early-church father, Clement of Alexandria, described the Gospel of John as a "spiritual account" of Jesus' life and teaching. Often considered more theological than historical, the portrait of Jesus in the Gospel of John is very different from the other Gospels. John includes stories about Jesus that do not appear in Matthew, Mark, and Luke. Some of these differences will be the focus of our discussions over the weeks and we hope you can attend any one of them as John is the Gospel readings during the season of Easter and interspersed throughout the year.

This is not a Bible lecture but rather a discussion of how what we read in Scripture is applicable to our daily life and faith. Attend either Mondays from 7:30-9:00 in Room 112 or Wednesday mornings from 9:30-11:00. No prior attendance or scriptural knowledge is required to gain insight and value from the discussion. Just drop on in. Bibles are available if you don't have one. See you in December. The following dates, reading, and topics are as follows:

Please stop by our table in the narthex after each worship service on Dec. 8 and 15 to receive your ornament and support God's beautiful creation. Thank you!




Sunday School:

And Jesus came and said to them,

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and <u>make disciples of all nations</u>, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

Making disciples of all nations.

That seems like a pretty tall task for Jesus to ask of us. Most of us when we think about disciple making think of a two-part process. The first is starting a family, having a child, or children, maybe through adoption. The second, is to bring them to the local church to get them "discipled", and get them to a Sunday School program, send them to confirmation, and just hope and pray that they continue their walk in faith after, if not in high school...then maybe when they get married and start their own families.

Don't get me wrong, all of these are ABSOLUTELY part of the discipleship process, and an important part of the life of the individuals in our churches, and for the work of the church itself. But it's definitely not the kind of work Jesus is describing. Instead, he's talking about an active process of reaching out to people who don't know the truth that is the Good News.

We no longer have to look at the "whole world" as some far off place. The truth is our own neighborhoods are filled with people who have never really heard the story of Jesus, and what God is really about. We don't have to go far to find a nation that needs Jesus, our own needs to hear this news.

And maybe it's the case that it's not the first time a person has heard the stories, but maybe they just need a reminder, an invitation to return to communities of faith.

Or maybe it's just encouraging them to take next steps as disciples. To really live out what they have been called to do as members of God's family. But all of that, is for another article.

Next month, we'll take a look at what it means to baptize these new disciples, and the significance of the 3 persons named in the baptism. "December a Great Month to INVITE Others to Come WITH You to Church"

December is a time of invitations. We get invited to one party and then another. We get invited to lunch or dinner at one or another friend's home. We get invited to concerts, plays, and ballet performances of the Nutcracker. We do our fair share of inviting others to the same in our weeks leading up to Christmas Day. The big question is, how often do we think about inviting people to join in our celebrating the birth of Christ at our Christmas Eve worship? Or how often do we think about inviting people to worship during Advent as we prepare for that celebration?

Jesus once told his disciples he would make them fish for people. But if we don't invite people to join us for worship or other ministry events or projects and expect people will simply show up that would be like going fishing and hoping the fish jump in the boat! December is an excellent month to invite people who don't have a church home to join with you in worship and various other events focused on Christmas. Here are some examples and opening lines you might try to invite them to join you.

Dec 1-8: Advent Giving Tree Shopping: "Say while we're out shopping can you help me buy a gift for my Advent Giving Tree family? Our church purchases over 200 gifts for families in need living in Camden County every Christmas and we picked up several tags from the Advent Giving Tree at our church last Sunday. Want to help me?" (If they ask more about it, invite them to join you for worship on Sunday and pick up a tag or two for themselves to help out.)

Dec 8: Drop N Shop Childcare: "I've still got some shopping to do for my children and my church's youth group is sponsoring a Drop 'n Shop childcare event from Noon to 3:00 on Sunday Dec 8. They'll have crafts, games, and children's Christmas shows for the kids to be involved in so they'll have some fun while we get some holiday tasks done. Want to drop off the kids and join me? We could even go to worship together beforehand if you like. Then we can grab some lunch and catch up along the way."

Dec 15: Children's Christmas Pageant: "Our Sunday school children are providing a unique retelling of the Nativity story and experiencing the wonder of Jesus' birth amidst all the hustle and bustle of life. There's even a breakfast planned for after the pageant so there's one less meal to worry about! With our children being such good friends I think they might enjoy seeing them in the audience. Why don't you come as our guests that day and join us? We'd love to have you and hope you can stay for the breakfast."

Dec 22: Lessons & Carols Worship: "Say, our church is holding a really great musical worship on December 22. It's a Lessons and Carols worship at the 10:30 service featuring all the choirs and guest instrumentalists. It's really a great way to get into the mood for Christmas and easy to follow along as well. Want to join us?"

Christmas Eve: "What are you doing Christmas Eve this year? Our church has a beautiful candle-light worship each year and we find it sets the tone for our celebration of Christmas the next day. We go to the (insert your worship preference here) because (insert your reason). We'd love to have you be our guest. Want to come? Here's a card (available at the Usher's Tables) in case you want a reminder or are interested in a different time. They're all great."

REMEMBER: New members start out as first time guests. First time guests start out as friends, neighbors, co-workers, and family members who were first INVITED by someone they know and trust to join them for worship or a ministry event. Don't forget to invite someone who doesn't have a church home to join you this Advent as we prepare for the celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas.

As I am writing this article, the lectionary readings for this Sunday are as gloomy as they can get - there is talk about warning signs and the end times. Sometimes I feel like that when I turn on the news, it's all doom and gloom. And yet, when I turn to the hymns and anthems we are doing this season, I am reminded that there is hope and light. For our Lessons & Carols this year (December 22nd at 10:30am! Mark your calendars!), one of the hymns we will sing is ELW 285,

Peace Came to Earth, which opens with the line "Peace came to earth at last that chosen night." That's how Christmas often feels - at last, there is peace and hope, and we are surrounded by our family. Maybe that's why every year, decorations come out earlier and earlier, because sometimes we need the reminder that hope and peace is coming. But we don't need to hang up lights or wait until Christmas to feel that peace. Peace came to Earth when Jesus was born, and the peace of God remains with us always.

Last week, as our children choir was coming up with an extra verse to do for their anthem, one of them suggested the line "God gives us hope, right now." I was so moved by this message - we have the peace and hope of God, right now, not only Christmas morning. I hope and pray that you find a way to carve out moments of peace and hope for you in the midst of this busy season. Maybe it's by paying attention to the words of a hymn you are singing on Sunday morning, or reading a book for pleasure or reflection, joining a group at church (ask our choir members - singing relieves stress!), meeting a friend for a coffee, or starting your day with prayer.

I'd like to end this month's reflection by saying a big thank you to all of you for a wonderful start to my season as music director. Your kindness and dedication is very appreciated, and you are what I am very thankful for this Thanksgiving season and beyond.






Poinsettia Memorials
