Phased Reopening of Sanctuary Worship Begins September 20 at 8:00

Despite the fact Governor Murphy reopened places of worship back in the summer the collective wisdom of the Council and staff was to prolong Our Savior's reopening of sanctuary worship until the risk of transmitting the Coronavirus was greatly minimized. With the transmission rate hovering at around 1.0, and there being no reported cases within our congregation, we now believe the time has come to partially reopen. Currently the state is restricting worship gatherings to 25% of capacity, which in Our Savior's case is 80 of the 320 nave capacity indicated on our official schematics. Consequently Our Savior's Worship and Music Committee has provided a phased reopening of our worship space beginning on September 20.

PLEASE NOTE: We believe the threat of contracting Covid-19 is still an issue, and recognize houses of worship have been indicated to be common locations and events that have created hotspots for outbreaks. In the event the transmission rate increases significantly we will not hesitate to suspend sanctuary worship to minimize transmission risk. In order to minimize, but not eliminate, the risk of contracting the virus the following worship schedule and details will begin on September 20.


8:00 Worship in Sanctuary: for no more than 80 worshippers, including worship assistants. Please adhere to the following.

- Enter only by the sliding doors on Wayne Avenue.
- Wear a mask covering both nose and mouth prior to entering the building. We will have some in case you forget
 to bring your own, but they will be required. Pastor Wayne will not lead worship if there is anyone unmasked in the congregation.
- Use the hand sanitizer available upon entering before moving to the sanctuary by the stairs or elevator if needed.
- A Worship Assistant will direct you to the next available pew as seating will be from the front to the back and every third pew to maintain a 6 foot distance between worshippers.
- Bulletins and communion elements (self-contained wafer and grape juice cups) will be in your pew for use during worship.
- There will be no singing or liturgy requiring congregational response to reduce the spread of water droplets. The order of service will basically be the Prayer of the Day, Readings, Sermon, Prayers, and Holy Communion.
- Worshippers will exit worship by the doors closest to the pulpit and directly out to the street from the stairwell exit doors.
- There will be no Coffee Hour in the narthex until the threat of Covid-19 is no greater than a regular virus infection.
- Bathrooms will have wipes available for users to self-sanitize the surfaces they use.
- **9:15 Zoom Reflections Worship**: Since this is a much more interactive worship between attendees we have been using Zoom Meetings for participants to engage in this worship experience. Singing is included as well as an opportunity to participate in the Meal portion of worship using bread and fruit of the vine elements in your home. Go to our website for Zoom link to join.

10:30 Facebook Live Worship: Given the restrictions that must be in place for in-sanctuary worship that include the restriction of congregational song and vocal participation in the liturgy it has been decided to keep this service as it has been during the quarantine until such time as the threat of Coronavirus transmission is no longer deemed a public health danger. We will not be admitting people to worship at this service, except for those providing worship leadership in the sanctuary (e.g. readers, vocalists, instrumentalists) as well as baptisms where only the family members are present. Go to our website for the link to the livestream or Our Savior's Facebook Page. NOTE: YOU DO NOT NEED A FACEBOOK ACCOUNT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE WEEKLY LIVESTREAM. maintain social distancing even when out has certainly challenged how the body of Christ remains connected while apart. Zoom Bible studies and discussions as well as ministry meetings have offered some sense of connection, but being with one another somehow is much more meaningful.

To that end I'll be offering the following opportunities for at least members to remain connected with me throughout the fall until the demand for social distancing has been alleviated.

Home Communion Porch/Patio Visitations: Sandy will be contacting those who I normally provide home communion visitations to inquire if they would be interested and willing to have me visit them outside on either their porch or patio while remaining socially distant. Prepackaged Holy Communion would be available as well that would not be a risk of contracting the virus. Please contact the church office if you wish to be added to this list. We can visit as long as the weather remains temperate. These will typically be scheduled for Thursday afternoons.

Parsonage Patio Office Hours: Every Wednesday afternoon from 2:00-4:00 I'll set up my "office" on the patio of the parsonage under the two big pine trees. If you'd like to stop by for a visit to chat, discuss spiritual or faith concerns, or ask a question that's been on your mind I'll be available to you as long as the weather holds out. Please call or text me on my cell phone in advance if possible to insure I'm not already meeting with someone. I suggest visits be limited to 30 minutes maximum unless no one else is at the gate. The parsonage is located next to the church on Wood Lane.

To this end I invite you to consider how you might also consider making porch and patio visits with other members of the congregation who are amenable to the opportunity. I'm only one member of Our Savior's body and I know so many of you have strong ties to others you may have only typically seen on Sunday mornings, and now haven't seen in five months. It may be longer still so why not take advantage of autumn's cooler temperatures and make time to visit one another before it gets dark at 5:00 and the temperatures dip to cool to be comfortable outside. We promise God, and each other, in the Affirmation of Baptism rite that we will "live among God's faithful people." During this half year of Corona-quarantine it has been difficult, if not impossible to be faithful to this promise in our usual way. We also recognize the importance of it and why it may have been the first promise we make, before even hearing God's Word and sharing in his Meal. Reconnect this September and October on your patios and porches with the people of God you normally saw on Sunday mornings in church. I know I surely will and look forward to it as soon as possible.



Bridge of Peace Ministry Update

Bridge of Peace continues its ministry to the people of Camden and surrounding areas. Demand continues to be great at The Peace Center (Bridge

of Peace's Food Pantry). It remains open each Monday evening and has been very busy. Over 100 people are served each week. Modifications have been made to keep everyone safe. Bags are packed for guests (instead of guests shopping for what they need) and picked up outside. Pantry staff are wearing masks and washing hands frequently. We are continually working to restock the pantry along with help from mission partners. God has been good in providing funds for this ministry through Mission Partners (including LCOS), the NJ Synod, an ELCA Daily Bread Matching Grant, and Lutheran Disaster Response.

Bridge of Peace is currently figuring out the best way to continue our vital youth ministry in the midst of COVID. Beginning in October, youth will pick up a bag dinner and materials for the month on the first Tuesday of each month. In lieu of weekly meetings, youth will receive a Bible story, activities, and a themed snack for each week in the month. LCOS will be providing the meals and activities for November.

There will not be a BOP Trunk or Treat this year. Bags of candy will be distributed to clients of the Peace Center and those attending church in person. Our Christmas celebration will also be modified; we hope to provide parents with Walmart gift cards so that they can shop for their children.

Our Savior Now Sponsors Rev. Janelle Neubauer, a Young Adult Global Missionary to Rwanda

For the past several years the Noisy Offering provided in worship by our children has gone toward Our Savior's annual \$1,000 sponsorship of the Rev. Eric and Rev. Wendolyn Trozzo in Borneo. With their ELCA Global Missionary commitment now fulfilled, and subsequently having been called to St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Moorestown and Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Tabernacle respectively, it was time to identify a new missionary to sponsor. Rev. Janelle Neubauer serves as Country Coordinator for the Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM) in Rwanda and is our newest missionary we spon-

sor. She works in partnership with the Lutheran Church of Rwanda in overseeing placement of young adult missionary volunteers for a year of accompaniment relationships, service, and learning within the body of Christ in Rwanda. She herself served as a YAGM missionary Jerusalem/West Bank and remains connected to communities in Jerusalem and Beit Sahour. Rev. Neubauer received her BA in Religious Studies and Kinesiology from the College of William and Mary and her Master of Divinity from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago before being ordained in April of 2017. Her home base states are Maryland, Virginia and South Carolina, and it is her Virginia roots that connect her to Our Savior. Her mother, Rev. Beth Neubauer, served as the pastor of Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Vienna VA before retiring, and it is where our youth mission trippers stay overnight each year when traveling to North Carolina to work with Habitat for Humanity. We look forward to getting to know our new missionary Rev. Janelle Neubauer in the months and year to come as we support her through our children's Noisy Offering and other contributions from congregation members. Zoom Confirmation Ministry Begins with Zoom Orientation on Sept. 13 at 6:30

Despite the continued threat of contracting the Coronavirus the beginning of another year of confirmation ministry with catechetical instruction begins Sunday, Sep 13, at 6:30 with a "Back to Confirmation Night" orientation for both youth and parents. Instead of meeting in the sanctuary Pastor Wayne will host a Zoom meeting at 6:30 for all seventh and eighth grade youth and one or both of their parents. The goals and volunteer opportunities of the program will be reviewed at that time as well as the unique roles parents will be asked to engage in since the Learn Events will be led by Zoom meeting for as long as the risk of Coronavirus transmission is still a reasonable risk. The class of about 18 seventh and eighth grade youth along with

parent Guides will cover the Sacraments, Lutheranism origins, Worship, and the Apostle's Creed at biweekly Learn Events. Each Learn Event's theme will utilize the Teen Study Bible all youth entering the ministry receive, Luther's Small Catechism, and a Faith 5 Journal at every event. They will also process what was shared in Zoom break out Small Groups with an adult Guide facilitating the conversation. In addition, the program includes:

- Play Events coordinated with the Oasis Youth ministry
- Serve Events ranging from making meals, hosting an Easter Egg Hunt, and Youth Sunday Worship leadership on Mother's Day, to serving either as an acolyte or singing in the Youth Choir once sanctuary worship resumes.

This year in particular Confirmation isn't just for youth any more. Parents are invited and encouraged to use the Faith 5 Journals provided to each youth to amplify the experience with the Home Devotions included with each Learn Event theme if possible. Pastor Wayne strongly believes the most important way to teach faith to our children is to first teach and empower loving adults to model and share the faith with them. In addition, parents have the opportunity to explore what they once learned in confirmation from the perspective and life experience of an adult and how that impacts their own faith in daily life.

Online Sunday School Begins Sep 13 from 9:30-10:10 Each Week

When parents promise at their child's baptism that they will "nurture them in faith and prayer" that includes providing for their instruction in the Christian faith, it likely didn't include figuring out how to do so during a pandemic. And even though Sunday school has only been around for about 150 years it has become for many parents the resource rely on to fulfill that baptismal promise in addition to the nurturing that goes on at home.



Sadly, with the likelihood of a vaccine or treatment for Covid-19 not likely to be readily available

and reliable until late in 2020, we've decided in the interest of the entire congregation there will be no in-church Sunday school for this program year. Instead, we will be implementing the following plan for parents to work with their children in sharing and teaching the online resources we will be providing.

Our Sunday School Pandemic Plan is as follows.

- Use the Sparkhouse digital online materials that are lectionary based that will include a video, an activity page (to be emailed), and a craft for families to work on together.
- Provide one Whirl Children's Bible for each family participating in online Sunday school. Please RSVP by September 2 if
 you plan to participate so Jaime can order enough by Rally Day. Bibles are \$22 each if you want to help defray the unbudgeted cost.
- Lead an online Zoom Meeting Sunday school class each Sunday at 9:30-10:10 in order to provide families to then worship with the Facebook Livestream service at 10:30.
- Provide an interactive component once a month

If your children participated in this summer's VBS it will be similar to that experience, and we hope even better.

This is certainly not the ideal situation for us to begin a new year of Sunday school and other Faith Stepping Stone ministry milestones in your child's life, however, it does provide families the opportunity to engage in a more intimate way with their child(ren)'s faith formation that we all promised to do at their baptism. Please know we welcome your feedback and suggestions on how we can best support you in keeping those baptismal promises through our online Sunday school for this year. We are still together as the body of Christ even when we are apart.
