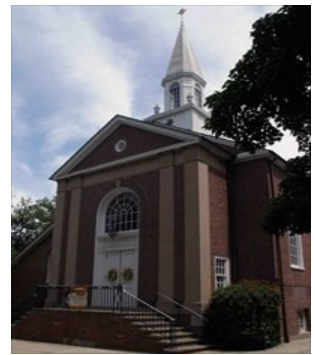

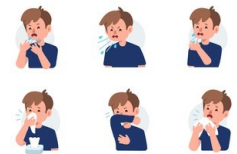
UPDATE: Sanctuary Worship Reopening in September – GET VACCINATED

As we've been preparing to fully reopen worship in September the Worship and Music Committee, Council, and Pastor Wayne all agree that the safety of the congregation remains an utmost importance, and we pray it is the same for our congregation members. The Delta variant of the Coronavirus is proving to be more highly contagious and the strain that is infecting and hospitalizing the non-vaccinated at an extremely high rate, including children. **As such, all members are strongly encouraged to get vaccinated for their own health safety, unless directed otherwise by their physician, and the safety of our children not yet eligible for vaccination.**

While Our Savior had planned to fully reopen sanctuary worship and Sunday school in September it is clear the current surge in the Delta variant warrants remaining at our current restrictions. The protocols for worship beginning in September are as follows:

BEFORE ATTENDING: DO NOT ATTEND WORSHIP IF YOU HAVE:

- A temperature over 100F.
- Non-allergy related coughing and sneezing.
- Shortness of breath.
- Been exposed to someone with COVID-19 in past 2 weeks.
- A higher risk for severe illness.

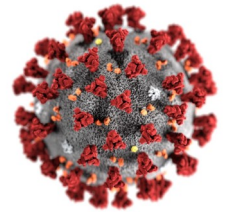


8:00 WORSHIP: FULLY VACCINATED ONLY

- Masks worn at your discretion.
- All pews available for seating.
- Congregational singing of liturgy and hymns.
- Holy Communion by intinction from Pastor or by self-contained cup/wafer in pew.

9:15 & 10:30 WORSHIP: VACCINATED AND NON-VACCINATED WORSHIPPERS

- Masks worn to protect your health and health of unvaccinated children
- Seating in RESERVED pews only.
- Congregational singing of liturgy and hymns at parishioners discretion.
- Holy Communion by intinction from Pastor or by self-contained cup/wafer in pew.



The 9:15 Reflections Worship will continue to provide a Zoom link for worshippers to participate in worship even though in-person attendance will be resuming. The Zoom link will remain on our website.

The 10:30 Worship will continue to provide a Livestream participation with a link on the website indefinitely going forward as many have found this to be an excellent way to "Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy" when physical attendance is not an option.



Faith Stepping Stones Blessing Services Shift Due to Coronavirus

September is once again a month chock full of blessing services for our families participating in our Faith Stepping Stones ministry of faith formation. There will be some changes in when the blessing services are held now that Sunday school children are going first to their classrooms on Sunday and joining parents for the Meal and Sending portion of worship around 11:15. Please take note of the dates, times, and locations of when each blessing will occur as some changes from the norm have been made.

Sep 12: Backpack Blessing: 10:00 a.m. in the Memorial Garden for all school age children.

Sep 12: Stepping into Sunday School for all 3-5 year olds for whom it is their first year before Blessing at end of the 10:30 worship.

Sep 12: Sunday School Teacher Installation after the Faith Stepping Stone blessing.

Sep 19: Stepping Into the Catechism at either the 8:00 or 10:30 worship services prior to the Prayer of the Day.

Sep 26: Stepping into Serving at the Altar for teens serving as acolytes at either the 8:00 or 10:30 worship services prior to the Prayer of the Day.

Beware of Phone & Email Scammers and Those Who Covet Your Possessions

"Hello Bob, I changed my bank and I want to effect the changes for the next pay date, let me know when to send my new bank information?" This was a recent email Our Savior's bookkeeper received from a scammer posing as Pastor me. Sadly, Our Savior's Parish Administrator, Sandy received a similar email from another phony Pastor Wayne. Thankfully each knew not to respond, to comply with the request, but instead shared the email with me. I then notified the police of the potential scam. How did they know it wasn't me? It certainly could have been a request I might make. More on that a bit later.

Scam artists are the epitome of covetous behavior. Martin Luther in his explanation of the Ninth Commandment of "You shall not covet your neighbor's house" writes; "We are to fear and love God, so that we do not try to trick our neighbors out of their inheritance or property or try to get it for ourselves by claiming to have a legal right to it and the like, but instead be of help and service to them in keeping what is theirs." Scam artists covet our assets, the resources God has provided for our well-being and for the care of others. Their schemes are meant to trick us into giving them what rightfully belongs to us and/or our neighbors. When Bob and Sandy alerted me to the emails they received they were living out Luther's understanding of the Ninth Commandment. They shared the email with me and I took steps to hold them accountable for their covetous and criminal actions.

In that same spirit here are some tips to remember if you or someone you know ever receive an email, text message or even a phone call from someone from the church, or any other organization or business for that matter, making any type of request that involves you purchasing gift cards, transferring money, or paying a bill or fine.

1. **Call the person or business directly to verify the request or claim.** If you receive the request by phone, hang up and call the person or business directly from another source (such as a credit card statement or utility bill as they are typically the two types of businesses scammers seem to impersonate the most. NOTE: THE IRS NEVER CALLS YOU ON THE PHONE OR SENDS A TEXT OR EMAIL. THE IRS ONLY COMMUNICATES BY WRITTEN MAIL. NEVER BELIEVE ANYONE CLAIMING TO BE FROM THE IRS.
2. **Never open emails or texts from senders you don't recognize.** In doing so you might be allowing the scammer to insert a malware into your phone or computer that will enable them to discover your passwords to online banking or credit card accounts.
3. **Never believe anyone threatening to shut off your power, phone, or internet unless you pay what they say you owe.** Hang up. Call that business from another information source (a past bill or statement) and ask to speak with Customer Service. Don't be afraid to hang up on anyone that speaks to you in a threatening manner. This form of intimidation is intended to make you comply to their demands and not think rationally. Hang up and verify the issue separately on your own.

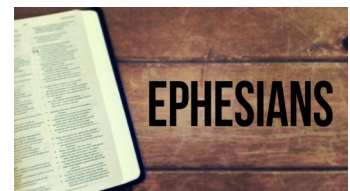
In keeping these three tips in mind you'll likely not fall prey to covetous scammers who tend to prey on those who are charitable, honest and forthright. And if you really want to go the next step in Christian love you might pray for them. It might include lines such as, "O God who provides enough for all and gives us each day what we need, I pray your spirit of contentment rest upon this person seeking to gain from me and others what is not rightfully theirs. Guide them in living a life of righteousness and to use the gifts you have given them not for evil but for good. May they and all those involved in scamming and scheming what belongs to others recognize the evil of such behavior, and turn from their self-serving ways toward a life and lifestyle that nurtures and strengthens our global community. In Jesus' name I pray." And remember, the only time I'll ever ask you for money is after the Prayers of the Church on Sunday morning or in a letter during a stewardship campaign. Never in a text or email. *Pastor Wayne*

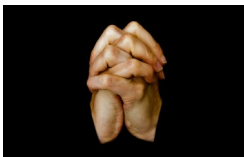
6-Week Bible Study of Ephesians Begins Week of Sep 20/22 – NOW IN PERSON!

Throughout the months of July and August the Epistle Readings have been from Paul's letter to the Ephesians. Since Pastor Wayne didn't preach on any of those readings he thought it would be a good idea to cover them in the fall Adult Bible Discussion for Daily Living. This letter describes the divisions between Jewish and Gentile followers of Jesus to be now broken down and reconciled in one body through the cross of Christ. This aligns with Paul's mission of bringing the gospel to the Gentiles with God's plan. The church, Christ's body, is called to share this mission and to live a life worthy of this calling. The final chapters provide several examples of how God's people can live out this calling.

Pantry Moving Forward:

As we safely emerge from the Pandemic, we look back on lessons learned. One lesson we learned from the monthly grocery gift cards for our Pantry Families, is that they like the flexibility of the gift cards,

one example is the option to buy fresh produce. We also know that there is dignity in buying your own groceries.

Hybrid Method: Starting back in July we have decided to use a hybrid method for our Pantry Families.

- Instead of food delivery twice a month, we will pack and deliver groceries once a month.
- Instead of utilizing the monetary donations to buy groceries to keep the Pantry stocked, we will use the monetary donations for grocery gift cards (half of what they are currently getting monthly).

Affirmation of Baptism

In Person Confirmation Ministry Begins with Orientation on Sept. 12 - 6:30-7:15 Acolyte Training Follows from 7:15-8:00

Despite the continued threat of contracting the Coronavirus, the beginning of another year of confirmation ministry with catechetical instruction begins Sunday, Sep 12, at 6:30 with an In-Person "Back to Confirmation Night" orientation for both 7th and 8th grade youth and parents. Parents and youth are to gather in the sanctuary, with each family sitting in a RE-SERVED pew to maintain distancing. Please wear a mask while in the building. The goals and volunteer opportunities of the program will be reviewed at that time as well as the unique roles parents will be asked to engage in. The class of about 28 seventh and eighth grade youth along with parent Small Group Guides will cover the Ten Commandments and the Lord's Prayer at biweekly Learn Events. Each Learn Event's theme will utilize the Teen Study Bible that all youth entering the ministry receive, Luther's Small Catechism, and a Faith5 Journal. They will also process what was shared in Small Groups with an adult Guide facilitating the conversation. In addition, the program includes:

- Play Events coordinated with the Oasis Youth ministry
- Serve Events ranging from making meals, hosting an Easter Egg Hunt, and Youth Sunday Worship leadership on Mother's Day, to serving either as an acolyte or singing in the Youth Choir once sanctuary worship resumes.

This year in particular Confirmation isn't just for youth. Parents are invited and encouraged to use the Faith5 Journals provided to each youth to amplify the experience with the Home Devotions included with each Learn Event theme, if possible. Pastor Wayne strongly believes the most important way to teach faith to our children is to first teach and empower loving adults to model and share the faith with them. In addition, parents have the opportunity to explore what they once learned in confirmation from the perspective and life experience of an adult and how that impacts their own faith in daily life.

Following the Orientation Jaime Frazier will lead the youth in training to be an acolyte. This will be the only training they receive so it is imperative that youth attend the orientation since no training was provided last year during the pandemic.

Memorial Gifts Fund Corner

Our Savior has been able to do many programs (i.e. Internships, Mustard Seed, Memorial Garden) above our annual budget due to the establishment of this fund. Continued contributions to the Endowment Fund will only enhance our ability to provide support for additional ministry programs and other special needs in the future.

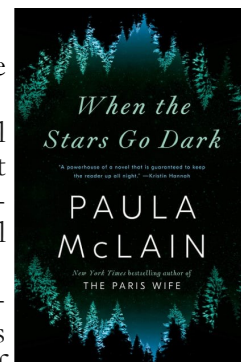
LCOS Book Club

The next meeting for the book club will be held on Wednesday, October 6, 2021 at 7:00 pm, where we will be discussing *When the Stars Go Dark* by Paula McLain.

Synopsis: Anna Hart is a missing persons detective in San Francisco. When tragedy strikes her personal life, Anna, desperate and numb, flees to the Northern California village of Mendocino to grieve. Yet the day she arrives, she learns a local teenage girl has gone missing. The crime feels frighteningly reminiscent of the most crucial time in Anna's childhood when the unsolved murder of a young girl touched Mendocino and changed the community forever.

As past and present collide, Anna realizes that she has been led to this moment. The most difficult lessons of her life have given her insight into how victims come into contact with violent predators. As Anna becomes obsessed with the missing girl, she must accept that true courage means getting out of her own way and learning to let others in. Weaving together actual cases of missing persons, trauma theory, and a hint of the metaphysical, this propulsive and deeply affecting novel tells a story of fate, necessary redemption, and what it takes, when the worst happens, to reclaim our lives--and our faith in one another.

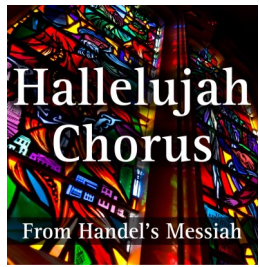

Sing! HALLELUJAH! (Literally!)

It feels like I have been waiting to write these words for about 20 years, but it's been about 18 months - we are finally resuming all choirs! Whether you or your child have been in choir before, or if you have been curious what it is like, now is the time to give it a try! You don't have to be able to read music to join, and you don't need prior experience. If you are an adult wanting to join the vocal choir, I do ask that you only join if you are vaccinated as we do sing in close proximity to each other. Adult Vocal Choir meets 8-9:30pm on Thursdays, and Adult Bells meet 7-8pm on Thursdays. Until the current COVID numbers go down, everyone (children and adults) is asked to wear a mask.

An opportunity for all to sing will be on Rally Sunday on September 12th at the 10:30 service as we will be singing the Hallelujah Chorus – something I promised since the beginning of the pandemic we'd sing the first Sunday the choirs are back in worship. We will have a brief rehearsal the Thursday before (September 9th 8-9pm) to (re)learn the music. Everyone is invited to join – and if you like your experience, please consider staying in the choir!

If you have a child, we have several opportunities for them to sing and ring:

- Cherub Choir (age 3 through 2nd grade)
- Children Vocal Choir and Handbell Choir (2nd – 6th grade)
- Youth Vocal and Handbell Choir (7th-12th grade)

Each choir meets once a week September through May (with a brief winter break) and sings/rings in worship once a month as well as for Lessons & Carols and Christmas Eve. I have not finalized rehearsal times for non-adult choirs yet as we're waiting for local sports/band/etc schedules to be finalized and I want to work with individual families to make sure we find a time that works for all.

God's Love Comes Down, God's People Turn Inward Stewards of Money

So far this year as we've looked inward to ponder how God is telling us to use His blessings, we've considered how we are stewards of time and talent and stewards of stuff. Now we turn to the subject Jesus talked about more than any other except the Kingdom of God—Money. This powerful resource has the ability to take our hearts with it. As Jesus said in Luke 12:34, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

God wants us to think about how we use *all* of our money, not just the portion that we give to this congregation to serve God and love our neighbor. How do we make decisions around the subject of money? How do we steward all of our money to make sure our use aligns with our values?

We all have attitudes, behaviors and feelings about money. Please take a few minutes to consider the questions below. The answers will show that experiences and teachings throughout your life influence your decisions now. They reveal your personal money autobiography.

1. What is the earliest experience with money that you remember?
2. As a child growing up, did you feel rich or poor? Why?
3. What was your attitude toward money as a teenager? How was this influenced by peers or siblings?
4. How were your attitudes and behaviors about money shaped by your family members?
5. What role did money play in your life as a young adult? Were you influenced by spouse or co-workers?
6. If you have children, did your relationship with money change when you became a parent?
7. What is your happiest memory in connection with money?
8. What is your unhappiest memory in connection with money?
9. How does your faith guide you in your use of money?
10. How do you feel about your present financial situation compared with a past situation?
11. Are you generous or stingy with your money? In what ways?
12. How do you decide what to give to churches and other nonprofits? Why do you give to these causes?
13. What kinds of risks are you willing to take with your money?
14. What will you do with your money as you approach the end of this life?

Hopefully, the questions above have revealed some insights about how you use money. Do your decisions align with your values? Remember, God cares about what we do with 100 percent of the money He has entrusted to our care, not just the fraction that we give to the church.

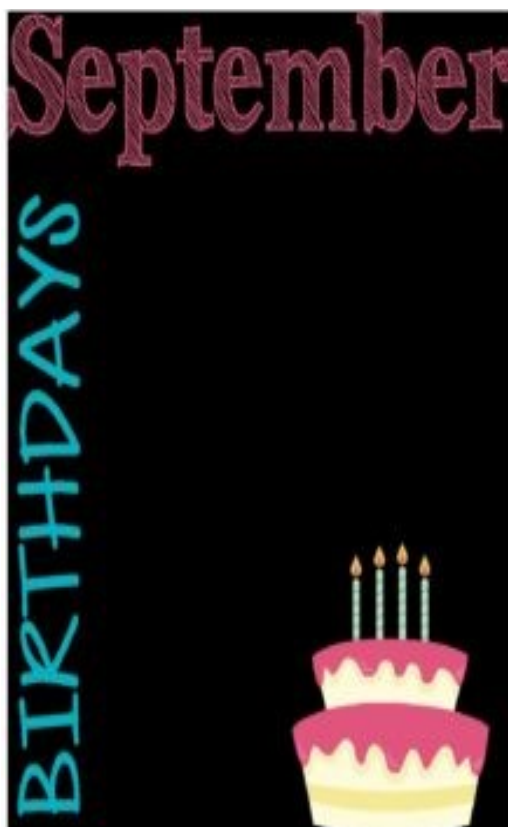
