Our Savior Saints Remembered on All Saints Sunday, Nov 7; Worship Begins in Memorial Garden

We continue the tradition for All Saints Sunday begun in 2016 of beginning the 8:00 and 10:30 worship services outside (weather permitting) with a Thanksgiving for the Saints of Our Savior who have entered Life Eternal since our last celebration of All Saints Sunday in 2020. Worshippers will process from the Memorial Garden into the sanctuary during the Gathering Hymn. Those with mobility concerns can gather in the narthex alcove that overlooks the Garden before walking

into the sanctuary and avoiding the stairs. We are working on a way we can livestream the Thanksgiving for the Saints in the Memorial Garden and then switch to the church cameras for the indoor portion of worship so those joining us virtually can participate in both parts. It may require stopping one livestream to begin another.

He graduated from Susquehanna University in 2015 with a degree in Political Science, Religious Studies, and Economics. After graduating, he was a ministry intern at Unity ELCA in Milwaukee, WI. The following year, he attended Union Theological Seminary in NYC, where he studied for two years. He transferred to United Lutheran Seminary in the spring of 2018 and is currently in his final year of studies toward completing a Master of Divinity degree. Tom's academic interests include the history of ideas of the Christian tradition, as well as contemplative traditions and practices. He also enjoys gardening, writing, and rooting on all Philly sports.

Memorial Garden Flag Retirement/Replacement on Veterans Day, Nov 11 @ 3:30

Our Savior has established a tradition with respect to retiring and replacing the United States flag that flies above our Memorial Garden by holding a short service on Veteran's Day each year, regardless of the day of the week on which it occurs. On Thursday, November 11, Veteran's Day, at 3:30, Pastor Wayne will lead a brief ceremony where the current flag will be retired, and a new flag will be flown. The time was changed to 3:30 so Scouts and other children might have the opportunity to attend as well after



school. The retired flag will be turned over to the American Legion Post 38 in Haddonfield for proper disposal. The Legion's American flag disposal receptacle and ceremony were an Eagle Scout project completed by Jonathan Baxter, a member of Our Savior. If you would like to donate a flag for future years it should be at least 3'x5' or 4'x6' in dimension for our 20-foot pole. We do not currently have a flag for this year. We look forward to this being an annual event to honor our veterans as well as retire and replace our Memorial Garden flag.

It's Time to Give Thanks In All Circumstances

I don't know what kind of a year you all have had but 2021 was not the big sigh of relief so many thought it would be after 2020. The Coronavirus pandemic is still a factor in curtailing our regular life activities. The struggle for racial equity has moved from protests in the streets and public square to legislative restrictions. The effects of climate crisis have been felt all over the world and Hurricane Ida certainly made

its mark in our area with devastating tornadoes and torrential flash floods leaving some homeless and others with water damaged homes. As of this article I've officiated 23 funerals this year, the most in one year, as well as the death of my best friend, my step-mother, and five friends or parents of friends. And there's still two months left in the year. 2021 felt in some ways more like being kicked when we're already down.

The Christians of Thessalonica were experiencing suffering and persecution for their worship of Jesus as Lord rather than worshiping Caesar as "God" or Emperor Octavian as the "son of God." And we think worshiping by livestream or in masks is difficult. Yet, in St. Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians he shares these words at the end. "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. Do not quench the Spirit."

Rejoice always? Give thanks in *all circumstances*? Is that even possible this Thanksgiving? Paul knows there will always be times of trial and tribulation in our lives, but simultaneously we have the promise and hope of new life the resurrection of Christ assures us. It is that Spirit of the risen Christ that dwells in each of us and when we rejoice and give thanks in all circumstances we fan the flame of the Spirit rather than quench in sorrow or despair.

So this Thanksgiving I rejoice in the marriage of my daughter, Brie, to her best friend and husband, Jared Novak. I give thanks for the addition of a "son" in our lives. I rejoice and give thanks for so many friends and family from across the globe that will be able to share in celebrating their wedding day the week before Thanksgiving.

I rejoice and give thanks for being married thirty years in October to Kate. We've come through a lot over those three decades and on this "pearl" anniversary we have come to realize the treasure that often lies inside that which is rough and challenging to open.

I rejoice and give thanks for those who are gathered for worship in person as well as those joining by the livestream. Preaching and leading worship to a church of empty pews was hollowing. Seeing the expressions of your faces, masked and unmasked, is a greater joy than you can imagine.

I rejoice and give thanks always for your generosity in giving of your time, talent, and treasure in the midst of uncertainty. Our Savior's ministry could not be where it is today without your ongoing commitment to the ministry we share.

I rejoice and give thanks for the vibrancy of Mustard Seed Community Childcare at Our Savior and the incredible Board of volunteers, staff, and this congregation that made it possible for parents in need of childcare to continue receiving it here. Their parents are so appreciative we took the risk to start it amidst the pandemic.

I could go on, but you get the message. Luther once said if we were to list all our blessings in life there would not be enough ink or paper to contain them all. As you prepare to sit down to a large or small gathering this Thanksgiving I invite you to take the time to at least write a short list of what you can rejoice and give thanks for in your life this year. In doing so your Spirit will not be quenched, it will be stoked as will your faith in our Lord who has promised to be with us always to the end of the age. Happy Thanksgiving!

Christmas Eve already??



Justice & Peace Committee to Meet Nov 14 @ 11:45 in Parish Hall

The initial meeting of the newly formed Justice & Peace Ministry Committee at Our Savior had twelve adults and two teens in attendance and focused on the basic question of "Where do we begin?" Not surprisingly, the answer is, "We already have!" The group shared the various injustice issues that were of importance to address. Those in italics have been a topic of book studies, ELCA Social Statement forums, or Pride Month observance in the last two to three years.

Gun Violence Women's Rights LGBTOIA+ Acceptance Housing Inequity Healthcare Hunger Immigration/Refugee Environmental Justice Student Loan Debt Poverty

Where do we go from here? The group agreed there were basically three to four areas we can begin to focus on before our next meeting on November 14 at 11:45 in the Parish Hall.

- **Awareness:** It became clear that Our Savior is already involved in justice and peace actions that range from participating in the Rev. Jehu Jones Bishop's Challenge to providing over \$16,000 in scholarships to Camden youth each year through our Memorial Gift Board. Providing the congregation a greater awareness of the justice and peace work that is already going on in our congregation as well as opportunities through the NJ Synod and/or other Lutheran and local churches needs to be a priority going forward. Check out the various subgroups our synodical Justice and Peace Mission Team has at www.njsynod.org/justice-and-peace.
- Racism: We will follow up on our relationship with Mt. Olivet and their endeavor to establish a youth drop-in center called the Dunamis House that would involve the renovation and repair of their parsonage next door to the church. With Pastor Wayne Zschech also being one of the leaders for the synod's Transforming White Privilege workshop and another round being held in early 2022 this may also be a natural next step for members to participate in racism awareness.
- 3. LGBTQIA+: Next steps will include participating in and being a sponsor of the Collingswood Pride Parade in 2022, and determining how to make those in the LGBTQIA+ community aware that the Lutheran Church of Our Savior is a safe and welcoming community of faith for them.
- Water Fountains: Pastor Zschech shared that years ago the NJ Synod Assembly passed a resolution for congregations to refrain from using bottled water at their ministry events and functions to minimize the amount of plastic bottles in world. One way to increase the use of refillable water bottles is to change our current water fountains to ones that allow for water bottles to be filled in addition to the regular water fountain spout.
