Christmas Eve Candlelight Communion Worship Times; 3:00, 5:00, 8:00, & 10:00

Sanctuary Limited to 150. Livestream Offered at 5:00 and 10:00.

Join the congregation in celebrating the birth of Christ this Christmas Eve at any of the four worship times that best fit your schedule. With the pandemic still an issue, despite vaccination rates, we will be maintaining social distancing in the pews and requiring masks worn during worship. This limits the seating capacity to about 150 per service with overflow seating in the Parish Hall. Both the 5:00 and 10:00 worship services will be provided by livestream as well. Here are the times and a brief description of each.

3:00 & 5:00 Family Worship: A Children's Sermon and anthems sung by both the Cherub (3:00) and Children's Choirs (5:00) as well as the Children's Bell Choir (5:00) ringing are the highlight of these worship services. These are great family -focused worship services and we hope you will invite your friends without a church home to join you. Communion will be celebrated and the service ends with candlelight singing of Silent Night.

8:00 Traditional/Youth Worship: The Youth Choir and Bell Choir continue to be the featured choir at this service and returning college students are invited to join them in singing familiar anthems if they choose. A traditional sermon is preached. Communion will be celebrated and the service ends with candlelight singing of Silent Night.


10:00 Classic "Midnight" Worship: The Adult Choir and Bell Choir are the featured choirs at this service with a traditional sermon preached from the pulpit or aisle. Communion will be celebrated and the service ends with candlelight singing of Silent Night.

"Christmas Is Best Celebrated 'In the Flesh' By Pastor Wayne Zschech

What are you looking forward to most this Christmas? Maybe it's getting to be with family – all the family – that you couldn't do last Christmas. Dropping off my sister's family gifts instead of gathering with them was disappointing. Even more heartbreaking was watching my daughter drop off her fiancé's and his family's gifts earlier and only being able to offer a Christmas handshake as he was a potential risk as a school-

teacher. Sitting next to my wife and daughter for Christmas Eve worship was something we haven't done since...ever. We even had a Zoom worship with other family and friends as we played the prerecorded service to get a "feel" of being together. But it wasn't the same as being next door.

For a pastor, Christmas Eve isn't the same without the clamor and commotion of multiple candlelight services to a packed sanctuary. I missed celebrating the incarnation of our Lord Jesus with you last year. I missed hearing our voices joined in singing the carols of Christmas. I missed placing the host in your hands at Holy Communion looking into your eyes as I proclaimed, "The body of Christ, given for you." We may have been together virtually, but there is something profoundly different when we are able to gather "in the flesh" for worship.

Which makes sense since at Christmas we celebrate the Word of God becoming flesh and dwelling among us. God had spoken to us for centuries through Scripture and the prophets. Somehow, we weren't getting the full picture. We didn't fully understand what God's will and love for us truly "looks like." So, God's Word became flesh and dwelled among us in the infant Jesus born at Christmas. And I think in some ways that's true for how the body of Christ maintains our sense of community as well. We need incarnational time together to experience what it means to be the body of Christ as a community of faith. Livestream worship was, and continues to be, a blessing during the pandemic and for those who could not worship with us on Sunday mornings. But there is something experientially different about worshipping together "in the flesh."

This Christmas Eve Our Savior is adding a fourth worship time at 3:00. We planned to add it in 2020 but, well, you know. It is intended to alleviate the huge crowd at the 5:00 Christmas Eve family worship as well as provide a worship service during daylight hours for those who prefer not to, or cannot, drive at night. We will be limiting the capacity of worship in the sanctuary to approximately 150-200 with overflow seating in the Parish Hall once we hit that number. We will not allow more than 5-6 people in a pew and continue the alternate seating in pews to maintain some distancing. We cannot go back to packing the pews this year as was common prior to the pandemic. The 5:00 and 10:00 services will be livestream services as well for those who still are uncomfortable coming out in large crowds and hope this will enable you to celebrate the Nativity of Our Lord with your family at home.

We give thanks for the vaccines that both reduce our risk of infection or severe reactions to the Covid-19 virus and will allow us this year to gather for worship more safely to celebrate the birth of Christ. In my opinion, Christmas is best celebrated "in the flesh" and I look forward to being with you on December 24 as we sing of, pray to, and consume the love of God made flesh in the person of Jesus who is the Christ-child. I truly do hope to see you then. Merry Christmas.

December 15 is the December Fund Raiser Date to Benefit Our Mustard Seed Community Childcare. Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

It is a blessing, honor and privilege to be able to be a part of the Lutheran Church of Our Savior for the coming year. My thanks to you all for your hospitality, generosity and kindness in welcoming me to your community. With the season of Advent soon upon us, I have been wondering quite a bit about this time of preparation, waiting and expectation. With many folks already decking the halls, it can be easy for this most sacred of times to slip our minds as we begin to ponder our present shopping lists! But there is the holiday of Thanksgiving, and of course the Church's season of Advent, before the birth of the Christ child.

Which brings me to wonder, could there be a relationship between the national holiday of Thanks-giving and the Church's season of Advent? I'm going to suggest that, in fact, there is. "Advent" comes from the Latin *adventus* meaning "a coming, approach, arrival". In common usage, it can refer to the appearance on the scene of all sorts of things deemed important or impactful. In our tradition, it is the coming of Christ that we long after, anticipate and hold of highest importance.

Historically, in parts of the Church, this season of Christ's arrival was a time of preparation for baptism at the feast of Epiphany in January. This preparatory period was for very intentional repentance, including disciplines like prayer and fasting. In general, repentance always means a "turning around" or a "changing of one's mind". It is always God's grace that effects this transformation, this tremendous, radical change of approach. Indeed, Jesus' very first words in the Gospel of Mark are "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news." Fulfilled could also be translated as "full" or "pregnant". "These are the birth pangs", as Jesus says elsewhere.

Throughout our lives, the Holy Spirit is working to "turn us around", to remind us just how near the Kingdom of God really is through our Lord, Jesus. Two of the concrete ways in which we see the Spirit at work is in our baptisms and at the Lord's table. In both instances, our response is one of thanks and praise. At table and in our daily lives, we receive the gift that God in Christ has given us! Now, you might be wondering—what does this have to do with the national holiday of Thanksgiving? Well, one tradition that my family practices every year at our Thanksgiving table is the sharing of "What are you thankful for?" It is one of those things that if we somehow forget to do it, someone—without fail—will remind the group and everyone (usually with an uproar of excitement) agrees to participate. There is something perhaps in the nature of offering our thanks that prompts joy while simultaneously praising the Divine who gives us all good things. There is something about that act that is both joyful and hopeful.

As we remember, with thanksgiving, our baptisms during this season of Advent and whenever the Spirit moves us, would that you would experience the exceeding joy and hope of God, ever-present and ever-active to turn us around to see the birth of Christ within our daily lives! "December a Great Month to INVITE Friends, Family, and Strangers to Church"

December is a time of invitations. We get invited to one party and then another. We get invited to lunch or dinner at one or another friend's home. We get invited to concerts, plays, and ballet performances of the Nutcracker. We do our fair share of inviting others to the same in our weeks leading up to Christmas Day. The big question is, how often do we think about inviting people to join in our celebrating the birth of Christ at our Christmas

Eve worship? Or how often do we think about inviting people to worship during Advent as we prepare for that celebration? Jesus once told his disciples he would make them fish for people. But if we don't invite people to join us for worship or other ministry events or projects and expect people will simply show up that would be like going fishing and hoping the fish jump in the boat! December is an excellent month to invite people who don't have a church home to worship and various other events focused on Christmas. Here are some examples and opening lines you might try to invite them to join you.

Nov 14 - Dec 5: Advent Giving Tree Shopping: "Say while we're out shopping can you help me buy a gift for my Advent Giving Tree family? Our church purchases over 200 gifts for families in need living in Camden County every Christmas and we picked up several tags from the Advent Giving Tree at our church last Sunday. Want to help me?" (If they ask more about it, invite them to join you for worship on Sunday and pick up a tag or two for themselves to help out.)

Dec 12: Children's Christmas Pageant: "Our Sunday school children are providing a unique retelling of the Nativity story and experiencing the wonder of Jesus' birth amidst all the hustle and bustle of life. There's also a sing-along! With our children being such good friends I think they might enjoy seeing them in the audience. Why don't you come as our guests that day and join us? We'd love to have you!"

Dec 19: Lessons & Carols Worship: "Say, our church is holding a really great musical worship on December 16. It's a Lessons and Carols worship at the 10:30 service featuring all the choirs and guest instrumentalists. It's really a great way to get into the mood for Christmas and easy to follow along as well. Want to join us?"

Christmas Eve: "What are you doing Christmas Eve this year? Our church has a beautiful candlelight worship each year and we find it sets the tone for our celebration of Christmas the next day. We go to the (insert your worship preference here) because (insert your reason). We'd love to have you be our guest. Want to come?

REMEMBER: New members start out as first time guests. Purpose: To live out our baptismal commitment to "strive for justice and peace in all the earth".

We focused on the four areas that we prioritized at the first meeting:

1. **Awareness:** Our first step is to gather, in one document, all our current activities and involvement in peace and justice issues on a local, state and national level. This includes, but is not limited to our Social Ministry outreach programs, programs supported by Memorial Gift Board, support for the Community

Social Worker, and support of the New Jersey State Synod and the ELCA. This information will be shared with the congregation as many of us (including members of the committee) are unaware of all that LCOS currently does in the area of justice and peace.

The second part of our *awareness project* is to canvas the congregation regarding peace and justice activities and groups in which you, the congregation, are participants.


One of our goals is to help you match your passion with a program, whether it is through a donation or membership involvement.

- 2. **Racism:** We will follow up on our relationship with Mt Olivet and their endeavor to establish a youth drop-in center at the Dunamis House that would involve the renovation and repair of their parsonage. On an educational level, there is an opportunity offered by the NJ Synod called "Transforming White Privilege" workshop in 2022. (Information will regarding how to sign up will be distributed.)
- 3. **LGBTQIA+:** The first step was approved by the committee; the development of a "Welcome" section on our website. The second step will be looking at our website regarding peace and justice activities.
- 4. **Environmental:** A subcommittee will be established. One of the first projects will be to refrain from using water bottles at all LCOS functions by repurposing our current water fountain to ones that allow for water bottles to be filled in addition to water fountain spout to be completed in 2022. The book that will be discussed at our mid week Lenten Soup Suppers with Christ the King will be *Laudatory is'*. It is the second encyclical of Pope Francis critiquing our consumerism, the degradation of our environment, and global warming.

Listen when angels sing.

Here is was: "Peace, be still." In a season that feels like we need to make up for not getting a "real" holiday season last year, a fall full of activities that had been put on hold, and a calendar filling up with commitments after a long time off... "Peace, be still and listen heart." In a season where there is so much division and stress... "Peace, be still." In a season when there seems to be so much to think about, we can be reminded to focus our thoughts on the coming of Christ, our Prince of Peace. "Peace, be still."

I hope you can join us on December 19th at the 10:30 service for a Lessons & Carols in person or on the livestream and will join us in song. I hope the anthems will bring you peace and joy after a long and exhausting 1.5 (almost 2!) years. "Peace, be still and listen heart."
